## **Admissions**

To identify each child's name, address, and personal physician. To initiate the examination process.

## **Body Measurements**

To measure each child's height and weight.

## **Vision**

To identify children who have problems with one or more of the following:

- far vision
- near vision
- stereoscopic vision
- eye muscle balance
- other aspects of eye health



## **Hearing**

To identify children who have a hearing loss.

## **Physical Examinations**

- \* To identify children with general physical health problems.
- \* To provide parent(s) and child instructions regarding health problems detected and referral to appropriate health professionals and agencies as necessary.
- \* To initiate treatment for certain minor illnesses.

## **Dental**

To identify children with dental problems.

- needs of oral hygiene
- cavities
- abnormalities in dental structure.

## **Developmental**

To identify children whose developmental level (developmental age) falls below the level (norm) expected of the child's chronological age.

## **Speech**

To identify children who have problems with one or more of the following:

- articulation
- syntax
- language reception
- language expression
- voice quality
- fluency

## **Nutrition/Diet**

- \* A healthy snack is offered to each child.
- \* Nutrition education and dietary consultation are offered to parents concerning their child's eating habits.

## **Behavior**

- \* Parents submit survey.
- \* Specialists available to discuss child rearing strategies.

## **Laboratory**

To screen children in the following areas:

- Blood Analysis (lead and anemia).
- Urinalysis.



## **Fingerprinting**

This is an optional service available to parents for child safety.

## **Motor Development**

To identify children who fall below the level (norm) that is expected of the child at his/her chronological age for motor skills.

## **Immunizations**

To provide children with age appropriate immunizations as needed.

## **Parent Satisfaction/Checkout**

- \* To survey parent satisfaction with the health examination and confirm accuracy of data recorded.
- \* Explain to parent(s) referrals made during the exams.
- \* Provide parent(s) with a list of appropriate personnel and/or agencies in order to obtain any needed services for their child.
