2010 Portland Conference: Progress in the Multidisciplinary Management of Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic Cancer

Course Objective:

There is controversy about the appropriate treatment after surgery for pancreatic cancer. This program will review the current state of the science for practicing clinicians. Sessions will emphasize practical information to improve clinical management of these patients from their initial consultation throughout the disease process. At the end of this course participants:

- Will be able to identify the current standard of care for adjuvant therapy for resected pancreatic cancer
- Will be able to articulate the role of endoscopic ultrasound in the evaluation of the patient with suspected pancreatic adenocarcinoma
- Will understand the appropriate management of the patient with suspected gallbladder cancer
- Will gain knowledge about the evaluation of patients with a newly recognized liver lesion
- Will be able to select the treatment options for limited hepatocellular carcinoma
- Will understand the treatment options for advanced hepatocellular carcinoma
