

Decision Tree for OHSU authors to comply with the new NIH Public Access Policy

Authors should avoid signing any agreements with publishers that do not allow the author to comply with the NIH Public Access Policy. The Library has language and addendums that you can add to your agreements with a Publisher to ensure that you retain your rights.

Question 1:
Does the NIH Public Access Policy apply to your manuscript? Go to: <http://becker.wustl.edu/pdf/NIHChart.pdf> to determine if you are required to comply

Question 2:
Are you the Primary Investigator who received the NIH funding that sponsored the work being published or have you been directed by your PI to submit this work on their behalf?

[The NIH wants only one copy of a manuscript to be submitted to PMC - The NIH assumes that the PI will be responsible for submitting any publications funded by NIH to PMC]

Question 3:
Is your manuscript being published in a journal that automatically submits material to PubMed Central? Go to: http://publicaccess.nih.gov/submit_process_journals.htm for a list of these publications

Question 4:
Select your preferred method to submit your manuscript to PubMed Central
