MOONLIGHTING POLICY- 2003

1. Residents may moonlight only with the written permission of their program directors and that is only given during the "research" year.;
2. Residents must have an Unlimited License from the Oregon Board of Medical Examiners and a personal DEA provider number;
3. Due to Medicare Regulations residents may moonlight at OHSU in ambulatory care settings or the Emergency Department only;
4. Residents may moonlight as general physicians only, with the following exception. If they have completed residency training and are either board eligible or certified, they may moonlight in their specialty capacities. For example, Cardiology Fellows could moonlight as an internists, since they are board eligible/certified in Internal Medicine. Surgery residents who have not completed their residencies may not moonlight as surgeons.
5. When making formal arrangements with an agency for moonlighting, residents:
 - a. must have their own malpractice insurance coverage (OHSU will not provide this);
 - b. should be credentialed by the agency with which they have contracted.
