Program Overview

- 6 Terms – Will follow fairly close to traditional academic schedule
 - Begin late September 2008-late March 2010
- Begin first nursing courses late September 2008
- Required 2 day orientation in Gresham in late September
 - Campus
 - Services-in-depth orientation to library
 - Introduction to faculty and administration
 - Boot Camp
 - HIPPA, BBP, Program Handbook and Policies



Course Delivery

1. 3 Kinds of Courses

Didactic/Theory

- Distributed using primarily WEB CT
- Requires 3-4 hours per week per credit
 - e.g. NRS 110 Health Promotion is a 5 credit course and will require 15-20 hours on-line per week
- Webinars
- Live Video Streaming



Course Delivery

2. Nursing Arts/Skills Lab

- Held at COCC on weekends (Saturday/Sunday)
- Students will travel for lab 3-4 times per lab in the first three terms, 2-3 times in terms 4-6
- Faculty will be employed by MHCC



Course Delivery

3. Clinical

Variety of experiences designed to prepare students for beginning practice

- Will use combination of experiences in both home community and at larger hospitals in Bend and possibly Klamath Falls
- Possibly 1 weekend at a large tertiary PDX hospital with focus on critical care, ED

Includes community based experiences in home community

Faculty Coordinators

Academic Advisor

- Will know all students
- Fulfill advising role i.e. monitor academic progress, provide referrals to services

Coordination

- Assures transition between terms is seamless
- Works closely with Clinical Coordinator to assure didactic, labs and clinical courses are linked and coordinated

Faculty Coordinators

- Clinical Coordinator- Diane Bauer
 - Leads planning and implementation of clinical/lab courses
 - Designs/Coordinates Lab and Clinical Activities
 - Some Teaching
 - Will work closely with faculty extenders
 - includes scheduled sit visits
 - Nurse Educator Associates (NEA)
 - Clinical Teaching Associates (CTA)
 - Works closely with Campus Faculty



Faculty Extenders

- **Nurse Educator Associate (NEA)** – refers to a registered nurse who may contribute to classroom and clinical instruction in collaboration with and under the direction of the nurse educator.
- Role/tasks will vary term to term
- 1-2 NEA's needed in each community
- Will work closely with Clinical Coordinator
- Oversee and assist with clinical activities in student's home community
 - e.g. communicate with community agency staff, monitor student activity, assess student performance, work with clinical coordinator to assure students are progressing
- Qualifications – Bachelors in Nursing 2 years experience



Faculty Extenders

- **Clinical Teaching Associate (CTA)**– refers to a nurse who has undergone specific education/training to serve as a role model, resource and coach for nursing students AKA as a preceptor
- Functions under the direction of the nurse educator or nurse educator associate.
- Used throughout program beginning in the third term
- Fifth and Sixth term students working primarily with the CTA
- Qualifications-RN with endorsed by hospital and approved by faculty



Training for Faculty Extenders

- OCNE CTA Training – 1 day
3-5 options available September-December
- Rural Nurse NEA training
2 days – will include 1 day CTA training and 1 day additional training

- Students will have two 5 day intensives that involve lab and clinical during the term

- Integrated experience in own community with CTA's that will involve a trained
CTA
Hospital NEA functioning in support position
Clinical Coordinator functioning as Faculty of Record
