## BECOMING A CONTRACTED CLINIC

Rx Outreach<sup>SM</sup> is a safe, affordable, and easy way for your patients to get medicines they need. Rx Outreach is a patient assistance program (PAP), offering eligible patients access to more than 50 generic medications. Through the Rx Outreach Contracted Clinics Program, selected healthcare facilities can handle patients' prescriptions efficiently. We provide contracted clinics with a streamlined application process, making it easy to submit – and pay for – prescriptions from multiple patients.

### Why should my clinic participate in the Rx Outreach contracted clinic program?

Contracting with Rx Outreach provides clinics the opportunity to:

- **Access an Rx Outreach manager**, who can assist with the unique implementation needs of your facility.
- **Foster continued patient contact.** All medications you order on behalf of your patients will be sent to your clinic for distribution. This provides an opportunity for your staff to meet with each patient to discuss the medication and how it fits in with the treatment plan.
- **Be flexible in sharing costs with patients.** For each prescription and refill ordered through Rx Outreach, there is a small fee (\$18 for a 90-day supply or \$30 for a 180-day supply). This fee covers administrative costs, including shipping and handling. Contracted clinics can choose how to bill the patient – offering the medicine at full cost to the patient, offering the medicine at a reduced amount, or offering the medicine at no cost. Clinics cannot charge more than the \$18 or \$30 Rx Outreach fee.
- **Use a streamlined application process.** Contracted clinics can submit the customized prescription form in batches, eliminating the need to fill out individual applications for each patient.
- **Pay for multiple prescriptions in each billing period.** Rx Outreach sends one invoice per billing period. Our remittance process includes detailed prescription reporting.

### How does having contracted clinic status benefit our patients?

Patient benefits include:

- **The convenience of getting medicines at one place.** Clinics distribute the medication to their patients. Patients using other PAPs have the added convenience of getting all of their medicines at one place, at one time. Patients enjoy the benefit of receiving their prescriptions at a place they know and trust. This convenience can lead to better compliance with their treatment programs.

- **No applications to complete.** PAP paperwork can intimidate some patients. Others may not remember to send in their prescription or payment, which can delay the receipt of their medication. Since Rx Outreach contracted clinics handle pre-qualification and the application process, patients are not burdened with paperwork.
- **The clinic handles eligibility qualifications.** Patients do not need to submit additional financial documentation. Clinics pre-qualify patients based on Rx Outreach financial guidelines.
- **Secure receipt of medication.** Medication is sent directly to the clinic for distribution.

### What are some of the terms included in a contract between Rx Outreach and a clinic?

Contracts between Rx Outreach and contracted clinics include, among other things, the clinic's agreement to:

- **Pre-qualify patients.** The clinic will ensure that patients meet the financial criteria for eligibility (annual income and number of people in the household).
- **Accept and distribute the medication.** Rx Outreach sends the medication directly to the clinic. Clinic staff is responsible for dispensing the medication to their patients.
- **Accept financial and payment terms.** Rx Outreach sends one invoice per billing period, allowing the clinic to pay for multiple prescriptions with just one check. Rx Outreach requires remittance within 10 days of the invoice date.

### How does my clinic contract with Rx Outreach?

Rx Outreach is managed by Express Scripts Specialty Distribution Services, Inc., (ESSDS), a fully licensed pharmacy. The company is committed to making the use of prescription drugs safer and more affordable. ESSDS reserves the right to add or delete medicines available in Rx Outreach, change fees in Rx Outreach, or discontinue Rx Outreach at any time. ESSDS does not accept returns of unused medicine, and fees are nonrefundable. ESSDS will send medicines to the address you choose. The clinic is responsible for the package once it arrives.
