James Sabin, MD is Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School, Director of the Ethics Program at Harvard Pilgrim Health Care, and co-director of the Center for Ethics in Managed Care. He has written more than 90 articles and chapters on clinical practice, resource allocation, and the ethics of managed health care. Written with Norman Daniels, MD, the second edition of their book, *Setting Limits Fairly*, was published by Oxford University Press in January 2008. With support from various foundations, he is investigating the ethics of managed care and attempting to influence the evolution of the U.S. health care system.

Dr. Sabin's practical wisdom comes from being directly involved in the operation of a large community-based health care plan and providing psychiatric clinical services for a wide range of patients over the past 40 years. **Dr. Sabin is also the keynote speaker at the 2008 statewide Kinsman Ethics Conference in Medford, Oregon on April 10 & 11, 2008 - "Something's Gotta Give: Values and Ethics in Oregon Health Reform."**
