The program also offers pre-and post-doctoral Fellowships supported by a T15 training grant from the National Library of Medicine and a Physician Subspecialty Fellowship in Clinical Informatics.

As Graduate Program Director, Dr. Mohan will work in close collaboration with the faculty leads of the HCIN (Dr. Nicole Weiskopf) and BCB (Drs. Eilis Boudreau and Lisa Karstens) tracks. He will provide leadership for DMICE, academic, educational curriculum development, strategic planning, recruitment and philanthropic activities. Dr. Mohan will also represent DMICE at the OHSU Graduate Council.

I want to thank Dr. Bill Hersh for leading the Graduate Program as Director since its inception in 1996. Dr. Hersh served as the inaugural Chair of DMICE from 2003 through 2022, and will continue as Principal Investigator of the T15 training grant, which is one of the longest-funded training grants at OHSU. He also continues to teach courses and mentor students in the program.

I would also like to thank Dr. Aaron Cohen for his exemplary service to DMICE and OHSU by serving on the Graduate Council since 2020.
