

Oracle Mission Code Definitions

Last Updated March 1, 2008

12 Sponsored Instruction & Training - Instructional or training activities funded by a grant, contract or cooperative agreement. This excludes Sponsored Research Training (25). **[For Use with Sponsored Projects ONLY]**

Examples of projects included in this mission are:

- Sponsored internships, apprenticeships, and instructional fellowships
- Curriculum development for OHSU students and faculty
- Educational conference grants for a primary audience of OHSU students or staff (including faculty)
- R13 Conference grants with the audience predominantly OHSU faculty and students
- Activity generally takes place in a classroom setting and not a lab
- Those with NIH/DHHS Activity codes such as:
 - D24 Nurse Practitioners Training Programs
 - D37 Allied Health Special Project Grants
 - T15 Continuing Education Training Program
 - K30 Clinical Research Curriculum Award

Activity excluded from this mission include:

- Conference grants for public service/outreach activities with a primary audience of non-OHSU students and staff (51)
- Research fellowships (either 21 or 25 (if specific to research training))
- Non-Sponsored Instruction & Training (11)
- Departmental Research (13)
- Sponsored Research Training (25)

21 Externally Sponsored Research - Research activities that are sponsored by Federal and non-Federal government agencies, private and not-for-profit organizations. These activities are separately budgeted and accounted for. Research means all research activities, both basic and applied. "Research" is defined as a systematic study directed toward fuller scientific knowledge or understanding of the subject studied. This does not include Sponsored Research Training (25) or Clinical Trials (54). **[For Use with Sponsored Projects ONLY]**

Examples of projects included in this mission are:

- Student research opportunity programs
- Funding to support epidemiology studies
- Clinical studies (could be either 21, 51, or 54)
- IACUC or IRB approval required (could be either 21, 51, or 54)
- Those with NIH/DHHS Activity codes such as the ones listed below that do not involve a drug, device and/or diagnostic used in humans:
 - R01 Research Project
 - R21 Exploratory/Development Grant
 - P01 Research Program Projects

Activity excluded from this mission include:

- Research Facilities Construction Grants (including ONPRC)
- Clinical Drug/Device Investigations of a drug, device or diagnostic used in humans (54)
- Instructional fellowships (12)
- Sponsored Instruction and Training (12)
- Departmental Research (13)
- Sponsored Research Training (25)
- Other Sponsored Activity (51)

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25 Sponsored Research Training - Research training activities that are sponsored by Federal and non-Federal government agencies, private and not-for-profit organizations. These activities involve the training of individuals in research techniques where such activities utilize the same facilities as other Organized Research activities (21) and where such activities are not included in Instruction (11 & 12) and Department Research (13). **[For Use with Sponsored Projects ONLY]**

Examples of projects included in this mission are:

- Research training grants that utilize the same facilities as other research grants
- Those with the following NIH/DHHS Activity codes that utilize the same facilities as other research activities:
 - F31 Predoctoral Individual National Research Service Award
 - F32 Postdoctoral Individual National Research Service Award
 - T32 Institutional National Research Service Award
 - T35 NRSA Short-Term Research Training
- All K awards "Research Career Programs" unless the activity occurs in Instruction space (then code to 12)

Activity excluded from this mission include:

- Training activities that do not occur in the same space as other research activities (12 or 51)
- Sponsored Instruction & Training (12)
- Externally Sponsored Research (21)
- Note: Not all research fellowships that require a mentor should be 'Research Training,' for example, not all American Heart Association fellowships are 'Research Training.'

51 Other Sponsored Activities - Programs and projects financed by Federal and non-Federal government agencies and private and not-for-profit organizations which involve the performance of work other than Instruction, Organized Research, or Clinical Trials. Examples of such programs and projects include medical and dental health service projects and community service programs. However, when any of these activities are undertaken by the institution without external support, they would be classified as Other Institutional Activities (52). **[For Use with Sponsored Projects ONLY]**

Examples of projects included in this mission are:

- Grants for public service/outreach activities including conferences, workshops and symposiums with a primary audience of non-OHSU students and staff (including faculty)
- Sponsored testing services
- Clinical studies (could be either 21, 51, or 54)
- A study involving only collection of data for entry into a registry.
- Fellowships for public service/outreach activities
- Curriculum development for non-OHSU students and faculty for "training course"
- Funding for clinical care activities such as treating patients in rural communities
- R13 Conference grants with the primary audience of non-OHSU faculty and students
- Awards to develop programs to integrate clinical and preventive health care services, research, community outreach and professional education and training.
- Those with NIH/DHHS Activity codes such as:
 - U77 Model Minority Health Professions Education Program
 - C06 Research Facilities Construction Grants (including ONPRC)

Activity excluded from this mission include:

- Sponsored Instruction (12)
- Externally Sponsored Research (21)
- Clinical Operations (31 or 39)
- Clinical Trials (54)

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54 Clinical Trials (including all FDA regulated clinical investigations) - A study of a drug (device, or diagnostic) where it "...is administered or dispensed to, or used involving, one or more human subjects." [1] and is a "prospective biomedical or behavioral research study of human subjects that is designed to answer specific questions about biomedical...interventions (drugs,... devices, or new ways of using known drugs...or devices)." [2] These studies include those which require a FDA IND [3], IDE [4], or 510(k) submission and Phase IV studies (those "conducted after a medicine is marketed to provide additional details about the medicine's efficacy or safety profile" [5]). Examples of projects included in this mission are:

- Activity involving humans and a drug, device, or diagnostic
- A study of an investigational drug, device or diagnostic
- A study of a marketed drug to test its effectiveness at a dosage which differs from the dose indicated on the product label.
- Sponsored activity associated with an IND or IDE number in humans
- Determining the clinical efficacy of a laboratory test to detect a disease in humans
- IRB approval required (could be either 21, 51, or 54)
- Clinical studies (could be either 21, 51, or 54)

Activity excluded from this mission include:

- Sponsored Instruction (12)
- Externally Sponsored Research (21)
- Clinical Operations (31 or 39)
- Other Sponsored Activities (51)
