# OHSU means more options.

**The Tram** is a 5 minute connection between Marquam Hill and South Waterfront. Consider waterfront connections when planning a trip to the hill, and vice-versa.

**Park and rides** are free parking lots outside the central city. Park and rides may shorten your trip and help you save money on parking.

**Bike share** can help with that last mile. Biketown stations are located at South Waterfront and throughout the central city.

**Car share** allows the flexibility to leave the car at home, saving on gas and parking. Services such as Zipcar, Getaround, Car2Go, Lyft, Uber and Curbed may help complete errands, travel to meetings or get home in a hurry.

**Mobile apps** help plan on the go. Plan a secondary option so you'll have a backup when your normal routine is interrupted.

## Transportation Options

Most employees take more than one travel mode during their career, or even in the same trip.

### Walking

### Biking

*Earn \$20 every 20 trips. Valet is free.*

OHSU Bike Program offers facilities, cash-for-biking, and trip tracking. At the Tram, our partner Go By Bike offers free valet protection, free loaner bikes, and professional repair. Anywhere but valet, U-locks recommended.

### Portland Aerial Tram

*Free with badge.*

The Tram is a 5 minute ride from South Waterfront (SW Moody Ave at SW Gibbs St) to Marquam Hill (Kohler Pavilion).

### OHSU Shuttle

*Free with badge.*

Marquam Hill Shuttle travels downtown every 30 minutes, 7am-5pm. South Waterfront Shuttle runs every 10 minutes on a load-n-go schedule.

### Portland Streetcar

*Free with badge.*

Stops are located in Nob Hill, downtown, Lloyd District, Inner SE and South Waterfront. All lines stop at Collaborative Life Sciences Building. NS Line continues south to the Tram.

### Public Transit

*\$70 a year with badge.*

Portland metro region: TriMet (ride. trimet.org); Vancouver: C-TRAN (c-tran.com). Express lines offer more options at peak times. Pick up a transit pass at Transportation and Parking. Park and Rides offer free parking at over 60 locations.

### Carpool

*50% or less of drive alone rates.*

At OHSU, your coworkers comprise the largest carpooling workforce in the central city. Any permit can be made a carpool, splitting the cost. Join OHSU's ride matching network:

### Driving

*\$14 a day. Park free at Park and Rides.*

With 20,000 visitors a day, low car commutes are essential to patient, emergency and neighborhood access. And due to a City cap on parking, OHSU does not directly control supply or demand. Most permits are wait listed. OHSU thus subsidizes alternatives.

A permit is required 8am-5pm weekdays at Marquam Hill and South Waterfront. Select areas may be restricted 24/7. Park by the day by visiting our website. Park by the hour using onsite pay stations.

Patients and their personal visitors park free during appointments. Call 503-494-8283 and provide your license plate to validate your patient parking. Patient parking is otherwise prohibited during paid hours.
