Latino Americans, the first major made-for-television documentary series about Latin-Americans, chronicles the rich and varied history and experiences of Latinos in the United States. As the largest minority group in the country, Latinos are more than 50 million strong. The changing context of American history provides a compelling backdrop to the story of immigration and redemption, of anguish and celebration, and the gradual construction of a new American identity.

Latinos Unidos Organization provides an opportunity for OHSU employees, students and volunteers to connect and collaborate across the institution to feel welcomed and valued, in addition to bringing together people from diverse backgrounds to promote diversity and inclusion activities, making visible the richness of diversity in the OHSU community.
