Interprofessional Ethics Fellowship Program

Purpose

To establish additional personal goals and an individualized plan in inter-professional ethics education by:

- Increasing knowledge of ethical theory and practice in the delivery of health care
- Enhancing bioethical awareness in teaching, healing and discovery at the University and the community
- Improving ethical decision-making by the application of ethical analysis and problem solving
- Fostering health care values, principles and professional codes in all patient care activities

Application Process

- Application form sent to potential applicants referred or expressing interest
- Candidate completes application form with essay and submits to Center
- Candidates selected by Development Committee using standard process
- Development Committee recommends to Ethics Center Executive Committee for final approval

Year I: Ethics Consultation & Related Skills

- Summer Seminar in Bioethics, University of Washington
 - ❖ One week of intensive ethics study
- OHSU ethics consultation training
 - ❖ Twice-monthly evening sessions led by faculty
 - ❖ 6 in-depth case analysis papers
 - ❖ Present one paper in evening session
- Participation in core events of Center as appropriate (Bioethics Study Group, Senior Clinicians' Seminar, Kinsman Conference, Palliative Care Conference, participating in Ethics Consultations)
- Mentor provides guidance during entire fellowship
- Performance evaluated by faculty and Development Committee to recommend for Year II

- Development Committee assesses performance and recommends future Ethics Center role to Executive Committee which approves future role
