Hospital transferred to State Control. 1975- Consolidation of University Hospitals North, South and OPC.

The material is mostly cumulative hospital and clinic statistics 1945-75. Also included are studies and surveys on the Outpatient clinic, a patient file, an historical University hospital timeline, and some miscellanea.
