Abstract	The collection is a small one donated by David E. Sullivan, M.D., to the Oregon State Medical Association after service in the Naval Medical Corps during WWII.

Biographical/Historical

David E. Sullivan, M.D., was an Oregon physician who served in the United States Navy during World War II. As a member of the Navy Medical Corps he served as a medical officer on the aircraft carrier USS Saratoga during the Pacific campaigns.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of 2 photographs of David E. Sullivan, M.D., M.C. USN, USS Saratoga, a photograph of a watercolor by Lt. (jg) Mitchell Jamieson, USNR Official U. S. Navy-Combat Artist, titled, Appendectomy at Sea; Naval Aviation News, May 15, 1944; and one letter of correspondence between David Sullivan and Mrs. McLean.

The materials are contained in a single file. It is housed with two other small collections of the same accession record grouping from 2005.

These records document the military careers of Oregon physicians serving in World War II through correspondence, clippings, and records of rank and decorations. They also document various aspects of the war effort and its impact on the physicians who served, including racial issues, POW experiences, and various service units. Specific units mentioned include the U.S.S. Comfort, 41st Division, 46th General Hospital, 91st Evacuation Hospital, 101st Airborne Division, and 104th Infantry Division.
