You will be working closely with your attending physician and many of his/her colleagues for the entire rotation. We do not have any residency programs so your patient experience will be very hands-on. You will be busy and you will have a very challenging and rewarding experience.

### **Student Housing/Transportation**

Students who require housing live in Duck's Village apartments ([www.ducksvillage.com](http://www.ducksvillage.com)) located between the two campuses of Sacred Heart Medical Center. Each bedroom in the multi-bedroom units has its own key and each unit has a limited amount of cooking amenities available to you as well as wireless connectivity. All you will need to bring with you is your bedding, towels, and personal items. A cleaning service comes into each apartment twice a month to clean the kitchen, bathroom and living room, and vacuum. The apartment complex is located on a bike path handy to both hospitals and most clinics. There is a large network of bike trails and designated bike lanes throughout the area. Lane Transit District (LTD) has a very comprehensive bus route if you choose not to bring a car and a free monthly pass can be provided. [www.ltd.org](http://www.ltd.org).
