Course Description	<p>The course reviews how governmental and non-governmental organizations influence health care delivery. Special emphasis is placed on current regulatory and legislative initiatives. Participants gain an increased understanding of the federal and state regulatory/reporting framework within which healthcare is delivered and the role of accreditation bodies within that framework. The course provides examples of the evolution of new legislative initiatives, both at the federal and state level, in order to demonstrate the complexity and impact of regulatory oversight on health care delivery. Guest lecturers provide the perspectives of experienced authorities on the Legislative process, the complexities of implementation of health care law, peer review and health care compliance.</p>
