

The Passing of a Pioneer

The following tribute was sent to us by OHSU graduate and retired faculty member C. Conrad Carter, MD:

To provide a view of what Family Medicine meant at one time, called General Practice then, and to eulogize one of those pioneers, the following

is the tale of **John L. Siemens, M.D**. His preparation included graduation from U. of Oregon Medical School '48, rotating internship at a Portland hospital, then what was called a General Practice residency of one year duration which included a rotation at Doernbecher Childrens' Hospital.

He then moved with his wife to Port Angeles, WA, rented office space, and went from there. He did emergency surgery, obstetrics, pediatrics, orthopedics, and counseling for a community mainly supported by the lumber industry. His office hours were over when the last patient left, and the day was over after the last house call, if there were no night emergencies. It is estimated that he delivered 2,500 babies over 35 years of commitment. His funeral was last spring, but one month ago, in gratitude for what his partner and he did for the North Olympic Peninsula, the Olympic Medical Center Foundation honored them by raising money in their name for the benefit of Obstetrics and Nursing Education at Olympic Medical Center.

This is an example of the pioneer breed that preceded today's 3 year Family Medicine training program graduates, as well as an model of the lasting gratitude a community has for such commitment.





In collaboration with the BMJ, **Matthew Thompson** and some colleagues have produced an iPhone app: The Doctor's Toolbag (released in the iTunes store last week). 


Doernbecher Healthy Lifestyle Clinic

Frequently Asked Questions

What is it?

The Doernbecher Healthy Lifestyle Clinic (DHLC) is a special clinic where we can look at the lifestyles of our pediatric patients. Over the last 30 years we



overweight or obese. Doernbecher has always been committed to improving the health of our children, and we are determined to extend that commitment to this group of kids.



If your child has been sent to our clinic, it is because your health care provider is worried about your child's health, and would like to have us examine his or her lifestyles more closely. This means that we will ask questions regarding his or her genetic history, eating habits, exercise patterns, screen time, and other important influences on their health.

We will also look for any other conditions that are associated with being overweight. Examples of these conditions are: Diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, gall stones, fatty liver disease, abnormal menstrual cycles, obstructive sleep apnea and many others.

What is involved in an appointment at the DHLC?

You will see a multidisciplinary team dedicated to overweight and obese children. This group consists of a pediatrician, a pediatric dietician, a pediatric trained physical therapist and a pediatric behavioral health psychologist. They work together with you and your family to overcome barriers to making healthy lifestyle changes. Our group will see your child every 3 months. Your initial appointment will be 3-4 hours long and follow-up appointments will be around 2 hours.

Will we be enrolled in a treatment program?

The DHLC is not a treatment program for overweight and obese children, although we may offer one in the future. There are other programs, within the Portland area, where we can send your child for weight management if appropriate. We are happy to give you more information on these programs during your visit.

When and where does the clinic take place?

The DHLC is located at our Doernbecher Westside Pediatric clinic in Bethany Village (see address below). The DHLC will be open the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month.

We are very excited to meet you and your child, and to get started on working on a plan towards improving their health!


