



## Ned Calonge Receives the Lovejoy Award

Bruce (Ned) Calonge, MD, MPH, is the 2011 recipient of the Esther Pohl Lovejoy MD Leadership Award, presented by Robert B. Taylor, MD on May 5 at the School of Medicine Alumni Awards Banquet held at the Waverly Country Club.

Ned is a 1984 graduate of the OHSU Family Medicine Residency Program, and served as the Chief Medical Officer of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. He has an exceptional record of national leadership in health affairs. Most noteworthy is his service as Chair of the US Preventive Services Task Force. Other leadership roles include membership on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Task Force on Community Preventive Services and the CDC's Evaluating Genomic Applications for Practice and Prevention Work Group.

Dr. Calonge currently serves as President and CEO of the *Colorado Trust*, a private grant-making foundation dedicated to advancing the health and well-being of the people of Colorado.

In accepting his award, Ned thanked Family Medicine faculty here in the early 1980s—Bill Fisher, Merle Pennington, Peter Goodwin, Mike Prislín, and Bob Taylor—crediting them for espousing values that have guided his career.

## Harry H. Rinehart, MD Receives Volunteer Faculty Award

Dr. Harry H. Rinehart is a family physician and geriatrician practicing in Nehalem on the northern Oregon coast. A 1972 graduate of OHSU School of Medicine, he did his residency at Madigan Army

Medical Center, graduating in 1975. He practiced in Prineville, went to the first Iraq War, came back and practiced briefly in Washington State and then came to Wheeler.

Dr. Rinehart has served on our faculty for more than 20 years, teaching in our OHSU Family Medicine Summer Observership Program for entering first-year medical students and the Rural Experience for 2nd year students.

He currently is medical director for The Rinehart Clinic, a private non-profit corporation and federally designated Rural Health Clinic. Dr. Rinehart is primarily interested in the treatment of chronic non-malignant pain management and serves many under- and uninsured patients in his rural community. In addition to serving on the Oregon Pain Management Commission, Dr. Rinehart is a member of the American Academy of Family Physicians, National Rural Health Association, National Association of Family Physicians, Oregon Rural Health Association, Oregon Medical Association and the Oregon Pain Society.

Our Oregon Federal delegation is very receptive to all these concepts and we had productive meetings with all four.

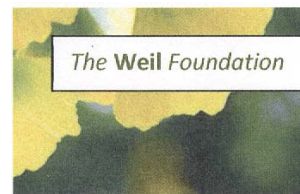

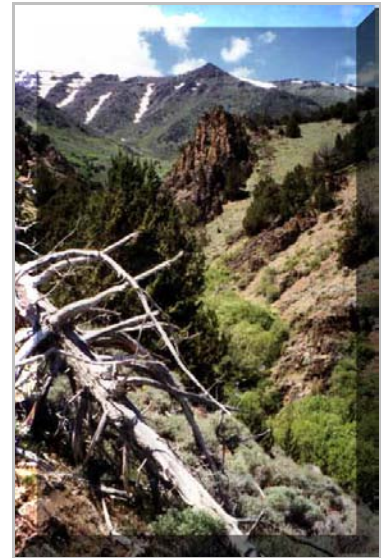
