Benjamin Schneider, M.D., Family Medicine assistant professor and clinician at Family Medicine at South Waterfront, has been named the 2014 Careers in Medicine Excellence in Medical Student Career Advising Individual Award recipient by the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC).



The national award recognizes the accomplishments and commitment of an advisor dedicated to helping students succeed in fulfilling their career and educational goals through effective career advising. Dr. Schneider was nominated by **Molly Osborne, M.D., Ph.D.**, Associate Dean for Student Affairs; **John Saultz, M.D.**, Chair of the Department of Family Medicine; and **Carolyn Litchman, M.D.**, a School of Medicine alumnus. The award will be presented at the AAMC 2014 Annual Meeting on Nov. 7 in Chicago.
