Laurel Case Lecture, Nov. 19

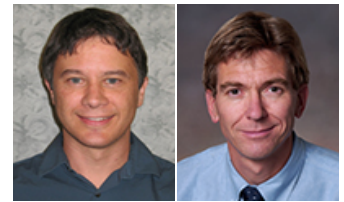

Mid-Columbia Medical Center Affiliation

OHSU Family Medicine is playing a role in the initial phases of the recently announced affiliation between OHSU and Mid-Columbia Medical Center in The Dalles.

The broad agreement between the two institutions is aimed at increasing access to primary and specialty care in the mid-Columbia region. Mid-Columbia approached OHSU asking for assistance in helping to infuse energy into their system of healthcare by integrating their physicians into the OHSU healthcare system.
