Understanding the economic and racial/ethnic disparities in cancer prevention services for women

ABSTRACT

Dr. Gatchell will give a brief overview of the disparities in cancer screening across income and race/ethnicity as viewed both from a national perspective as well as from the perspective of two states: California (based on her research) and Oregon (for the interest of the audience). Dr. Gatchell will then share some of the factors that she's interested in, such as the (potential) role of community clinics in addressing these social disparities in prevention, the possible barriers to access as a result of perceived discrimination in the health care system, and the role of contextual poverty in influencing the operation of these factors.
