Responsible and Ethical Conduct of Research with Ethnocultural Populations and Communities

ABSTRACT

The goal of the lecture is to raise points to encourage ethical decision making for research with ethnocultural populations that reflect the unique historical and socio-cultural realities of ethnic and racial people and their communities. Emphasis will be placed on four ethical dimensions of culturally sensitive research: (1) applying a cultural perspective to the evaluation of research risk and benefits; (2) developing and implementing culturally respectful informed consent procedures; (3) constructing culturally appropriate confidentiality and disclosure policies; and (4) engaging in community and participant consultation with a standard of "principled cultural sensitivity."
