Scholarship and Financial Aid Information

Students interested in finding resources to fund their education should consider filing the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Financial aid can only be awarded to students who have been accepted for admission, so it is important that new students complete the FAFSA at the same time as they are applying to the institution. It is also very important that you observe the financial aid application deadlines and preferential filing dates. Residents of counties adjacent to the Oregon border in California, Idaho, Nevada or Washington pay Resident Tuition rates. Non-resident undergraduate nursing students on the La Grande campus will also pay Resident Tuition rates if they are residents of Idaho or Washington and have completed at least one term at EOU prior to entering the undergraduate nursing program. Students eligible for either of these exemptions must notify the Registrar's Office by the first day of the academic term. Tuition for terms prior to the date the student notifies the Registrar's Office will continue to be charged at the non-resident rate.

Additional notes:

** Most students are required to purchase OHSU major medical insurance or currently be covered under a medical insurance policy approved by OHSU. This cost is included in your fees. Exceptions apply to the RNBS, MPH, Graduate Certificate in Public Health, HSOL, and PMCO programs. Non-matriculated students are not eligible to purchase major medical insurance.

** Tuition and fees are subject to change each July.

Non-resident PhD and post-master's DNP nursing students from states participating in the Western Regional Graduate Program of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education pay Resident Tuition rates. Participants include Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wyoming and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. Students eligible for this exemption must notify the Registrar's Office by the first day of the academic term. Tuition for terms prior to the date the student notifies the Registrar's Office will continue to be charged at the non-resident rate.

Students admitted as a non-resident will be assessed "out-of-state" tuition. This classification remains the same while continuously enrolled as a student at OHSU. In state residency cannot be established while fully enrolled for the purposes of tuition assessment.
