The Child Development & Rehabilitation Center (CDRC) Autism Program provides services to children and adolescents with diagnosed or suspected symptoms of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

Our Team

The CDRC Autism Program consists of an interdisciplinary team, including:

- Clinical Psychologists
- Developmental Pediatricians
- Psychiatrists
- Speech-Language Pathologists
- Occupational Therapists
- Audiologists
- Physical Therapists
- · Other clinicians as needed

Diagnostic Evaluation

Diagnostic evaluations are offered for children (ages 1-18) suspected of having ASD.

Our specially trained clinicians use structured assessment tools, informal observations, behavior checklists, interviews, and school and medical information to help with evaluations.

Afterward we provide families with a feedback session to discuss results and recommendations.

Treatment

Treatment options are individualized to meet the unique needs of the families we serve and may include:

- Pediatric specialty services, including Gastroenterologists, Neurologists, Geneticists, Sleep Specialists, and Feeding Specialists
- Sessions with Speech-Language Pathologists and Occupational Therapists
- Time with Psychologists to address behavioral issues including food selectivity and self-injurious behavior

Follow-Along Services

The CDRC Autism Program offers follow-along services for all individuals who receive a diagnosis of ASD. Services may include:

- Support from our family consultant
- A three month follow-up appointment with a Developmental Pediatrician to answer questions and address concerns
- Information on local resources through the CaCoon and Community Connections Networks
