

Hearing Loss Research Study

Subjects are invited to participate in a research study in Lina Reiss's Cochlear Implant and Hearing Aid Research Laboratory in the Department of Otolaryngology at the Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU). This National Institutes of Health funded research project is aimed to improve our knowledge of how to improve listening with cochlear implants and hearing aids. In this particular study, we will be studying how sound input from two ears combine in a listener with hearing loss and how this might explain some of the variability observed in cochlear implant and hearing aid users.

Subject Criteria

- Adults (>17 years old)
- Moderate to profound (40-90 dB) hearing loss in both ears (candidacy for this study will be determined by reviewing an audiogram completed within one year or through a hearing test completed at the research study visit)

You will be asked to listen to sounds and words, and respond by pressing the appropriate button on a computer touch screen. The time needed to complete the study is a total of 8-12 hours, divided into two to four sessions (2-4 hours/session). In addition, you will receive \$15/hour for your time and compensation for travel mileage and parking.
