

Pediatric Research Study – Normal Hearing

Children between 6-8 years of age with normal hearing are invited to participate as control subjects in a research study in Lina Reiss's Cochlear Implant and Hearing Aid Research Laboratory in the Department of Otolaryngology at the Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU). This National Institutes of Health funded research project is aimed to improve our knowledge of how to improve speech and music perception for children with hearing loss.

In this particular study, we are studying how children combine sounds between the two ears, and how this may explain some of the variability in speech and music perception abilities for children with hearing loss. We are also studying how age and development in children affect how sounds are combined between ears.

Subject Criteria

- Children (6-8 years old)
- Normal hearing

In this study, we will evaluate children over time during development, starting at around 6-8 years of age, with repeat testing once a year for five years. Your child will be asked to listen to sounds and words, and respond by pressing the appropriate button on a computer touch screen. The time needed to complete the testing each year is a total of 5-6 hours, which can be divided into up to four shorter sessions of 1-2.5 hours per session.

Compensation would be provided for your child's time (\$10/hour), travel mileage (\$0.25/mile), and parking.
