OHSU is pleased to announce that 2 new cardiologists have joined the Cardiovascular Division.



Dr. Eric Stecker is an electrophysiologist. Dr Stecker received his M.D. degree from the University of Wisconsin and completed his internal medicine residency at OHSU following which he received his MPH degree from the University of Michigan. He then returned to OHSU to complete fellowships in general cardiology and electrophysiology. He entered private practice for a year before returning to join the electrophysiology team at OHSU. Dr. Stecker's main interests are catheter-based approaches for ventricular tachycardia ablation and cost-effectiveness of implantable cardiac defibrillators.



Dr. Saurabh Gupta is an interventional cardiologist. He received his M.B.;B.S. degree from the University of Delhi in India and completed his internal medicine residency at the St. Luke's-Roosevelt Hospital Center of the College of Physicians & Surgeons, Columbia University in New York. He went into private practice for 5 years as an internist before moving to Salt Lake city to complete fellowships in general and interventional cardiology at the University of Utah. Dr. Gupta's main interest is the development of percutaneous approaches for valve replacement.
