



Holoprocencephaly

Holoprocencephaly (HPE) (hol-o-pros-en-ceph-a-ly) is a birth anomaly in which the developing brain in very early pregnancy doesn't separate normally into separate left and right halves. This condition can also affect development of the head and face. Holoprocencephaly signs can include intellectual disability and problems with the brain's pituitary gland, which is a master control system for many hormones in the body. Holoprocencephaly can be caused by problems with genes, exposure of the mother to certain substances during pregnancy, or the cause can be unknown.
