

Congenital Cataract

Congenital cataract (con-gen-i-tal cat-a-ract) is when a baby is born with a clouded lens of one or both eyes. The lens of the eye normally should be clear. When there is a cataract, light that comes into the eye cannot shine well enough through the lens to be focused at the back of the eye, which is needed for clear sight.
