

Turner's Syndrome

Turner Syndrome is a chromosomal condition that affects development in girls. The most common feature of Turner syndrome is being short in height, which is noticed by about age 5. It is also very common for the ovaries to not work. Many girls with Turner Syndrome do not go through puberty unless they get treatment to replace the missing female hormones. Most of them are unable to conceive children in later life. Most girls and women with Turner syndrome have normal mental development.
