

Craniosynostosis

Craniosynostosis (krā-nē-ō-ṣi-nā-'stō-səs) is a birth anomaly of the skull. When the skull is forming as a child develops in the womb, it is made up of many pieces that all join together like a puzzle. The areas where they join are called sutures, and the materials where they join is flexible. This allows the skull to grow rapidly around the fast-growing brain. If a baby has craniosynostosis, it means that one or more of these sutures closes too soon and becomes solid bone. This changes the shape of the skull and its ability to grow evenly. Normally, the sutures do not all close until late in the teen years. In craniosynostosis, there can be abnormal features of the face, ears, and hairline, and developmental disabilities.
