COURSE DESCRIPTION

The overall objective of this activity is to prevent, accurately diagnose, and optimally treat infectious diseases.

Specific learning objectives, based on documented gaps in current practice supported through regional and national data, will address clinical problems related to:

Participants will also learn about new antibiotics and other therapeutic agents, updated practice guidelines, and strategies for prevention of infections, including the latest vaccine recommendations.

Case-based discussions and ample time for questions will supplement large group presentations. Participants will be able to immediately implement what they learn into their practices so that patient outcomes improve.
