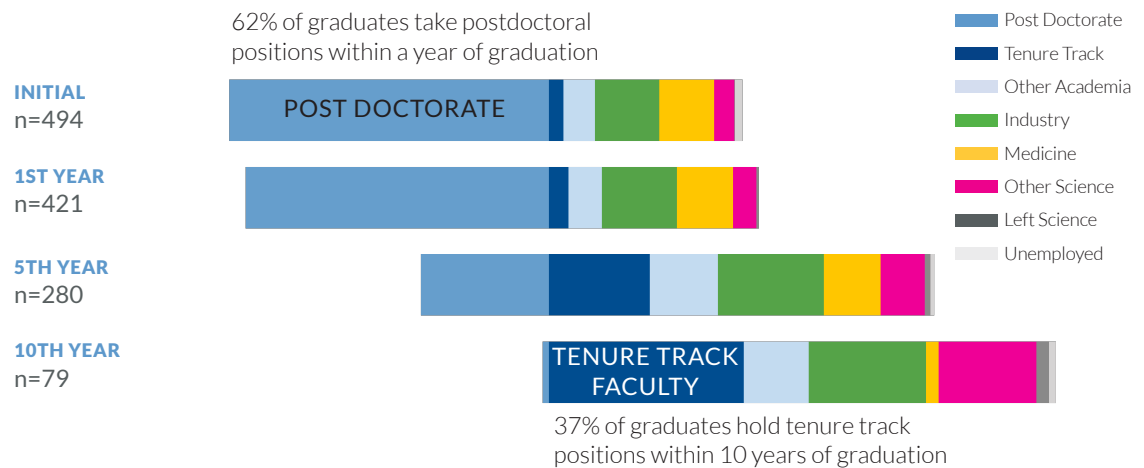

### Key Points

- 62% of graduates take a post-doctoral positions after graduation.
- 66% of graduates completing postdoctoral training do so at a top-50 Blue Ridge research institution.
- 99% of graduates complete their postdoctoral training within 10 years.
- A greater % of graduates from engineering programs move to industry when compared to the basic science programs.
- 1 year after graduation:
  - 62% of graduates remain on the west coast.
  - 32% of graduates choose to stay at OHSU for a postdoc.
  - 0% are unemployed except by choice.
- Within 5 years of graduation, 59% of graduates remain in academia and over half of those graduates hold tenure-track positions.
- OHSU graduates hold tenure track positions at 55 universities across the world including Cornell, Duke, Harvard, Northwestern, UCSF, and UW.
- 113 companies employ 21% of graduates after 5 years, including 4 companies started by OHSU graduates.
- Our methodology yields 90% of graduate position data.

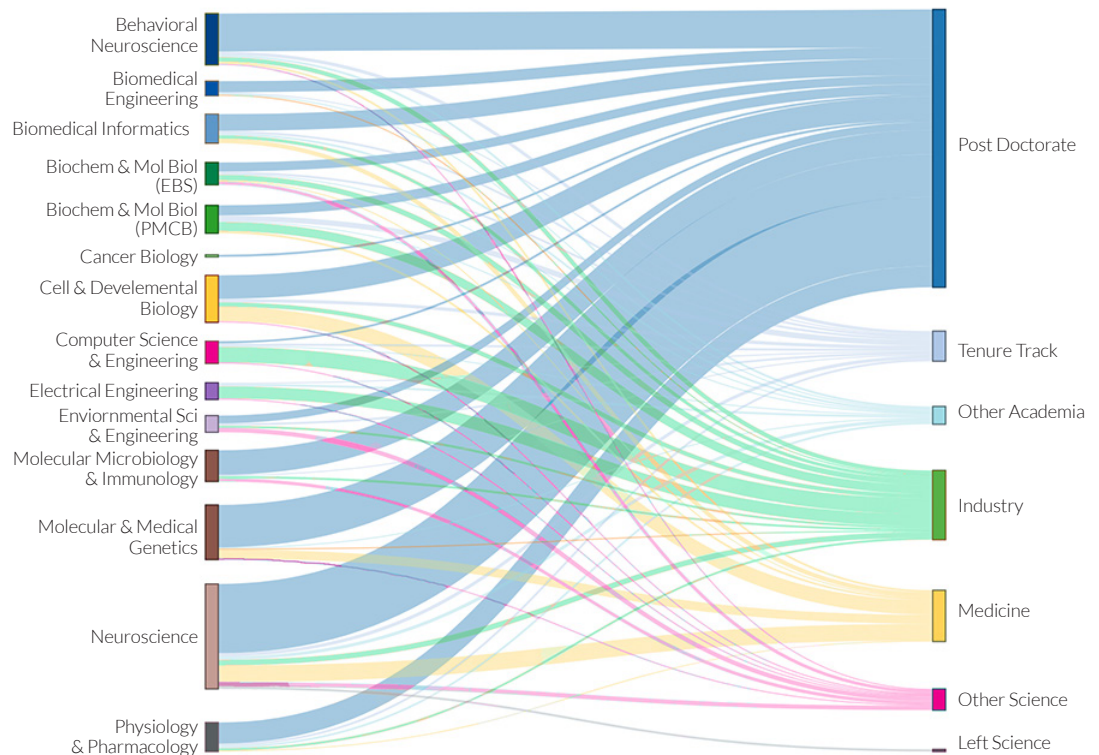
### 37% of graduates become tenure track faculty within 10 years

**DATA NOTES:** Data were compiled by academic year from OHSU programs and mentors and were confirmed by current CV's and employer records. Data is collected at the time the degree was awarded, one, five, and ten years after graduation. Raw data is available upon request in office of Graduate Studies in the SOM. 'Medicine' category includes MD/PhD students returning to medical school and practicing health care providers except those with tenured faculty positions at academic medical institutions. These positions were sorted into the 'Academic Tenure Track' category. 'Other Science' includes graduates with science related positions in law, government, education, publishing as well as graduates returning to school for other degrees. Positions that could not be verified were excluded from this report.
