

Anotia/Microtia

Anotia/microtia (an-'ō-sh(ē-)ə/mī-'krō-sh(ē-)ə) are birth anomalies of the ears. In anotia, the external ear, the part of the ear that you can see, is missing completely. In microtia, the external ear is small and not formed properly. Most of the time, anotia/microtia affects how the baby's ear looks, while the parts of the ear inside the head (the middle and inner ear) are not affected. However, some babies with this anomaly will also have a narrow or missing ear canal. This can mean that the baby has problems hearing with that ear or is deaf in that ear.
