

Posterior Urethral Valves

Posterior Urethral Valves is a birth anomaly of the urethra in boys. The urethra is the tube that connects the bladder, which stores urine, or pee, to the tip of the penis. Urethral valves are small flaps on the inside of the urethra. In this condition, the valves partly block the tube, and urine can't flow normally from the bladder. The urine backs up and can damage all of the urinary tract organs including the urethra, bladder, ureters, and kidneys.
