Psychiatric disorders are incredibly common in primary care settings. Limited access to mental health specialty care has led to an increase in psychiatric diagnosis and treatment in the primary care clinic. The goal of this conference is to better equip the primary care provider in delivering effective mental health care to their patients.

The target audience for this conference is family physicians, internists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and other providers of adult care.

At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Understand common mechanisms involved in TBI along with the diagnosis and management of neuropsychiatric sequelae
- Differentiate between different dementia types and determine the proper treatment
- Recognize psychiatric illness in women at different points in the reproductive life cycles
