Oregon ECHO Network connects the Oregon healthcare workforce with specialist faculty for case-based education and community-building.

Oregon ECHO Network aims to improve patient care in communities across the state. ECHO learners join interactive video sessions to discuss a de-identified patient case or a systems/workflow challenge. Sessions also include a brief, practical expert presentation.

Our programs use the Project ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) model developed at the University of New Mexico and replicated around the globe.

ECHO programs are offered at no cost to participants, and a no-cost CME is usually available.
