Demographics

428 adults with I/DD participated in the 2017-18 survey in Oregon

Respondents are adults with I/DD age 18 and older receiving at least one paid service (in addition to case management) from the state DD agency.

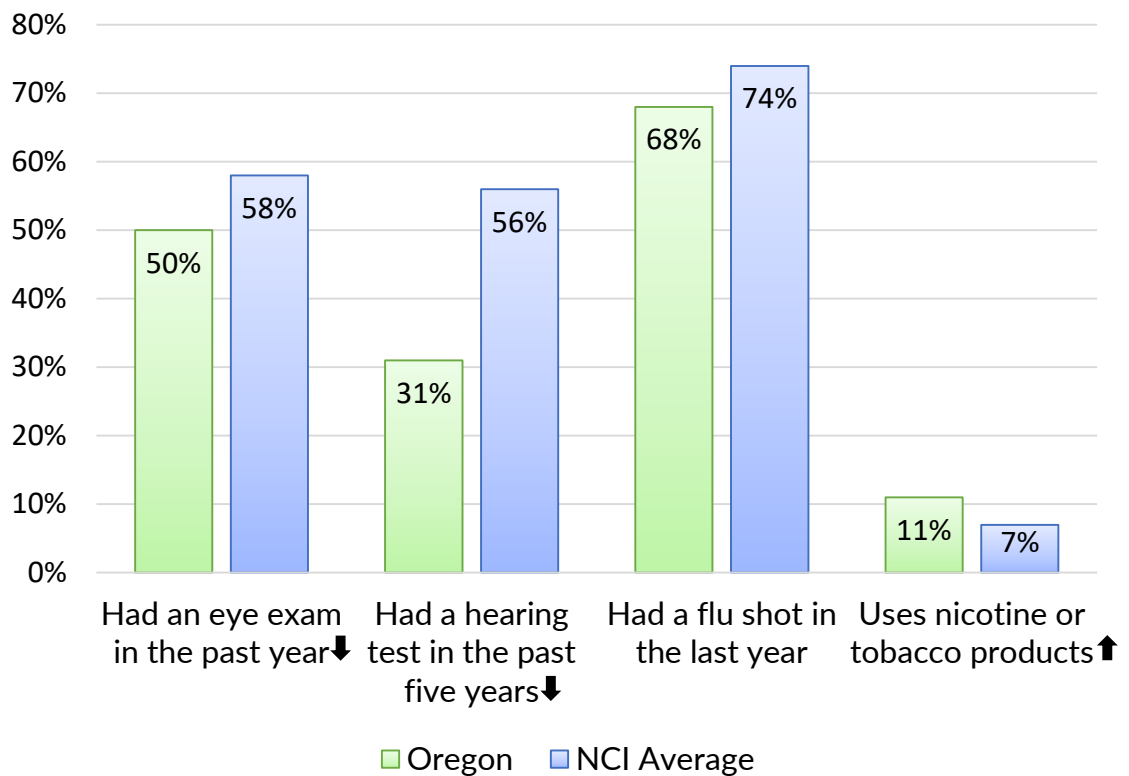


Healthcare & Wellness

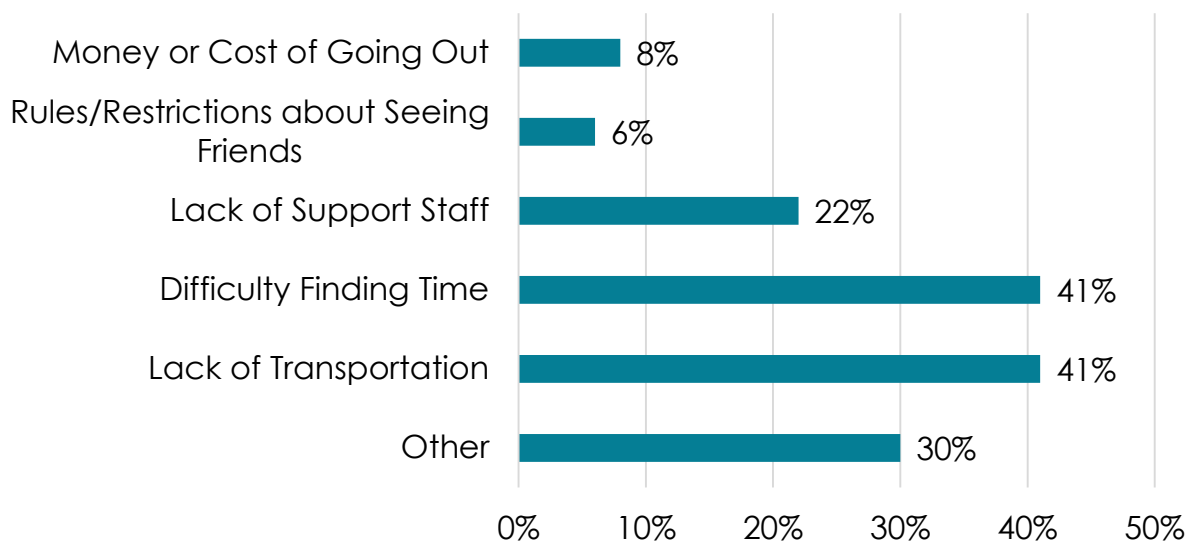

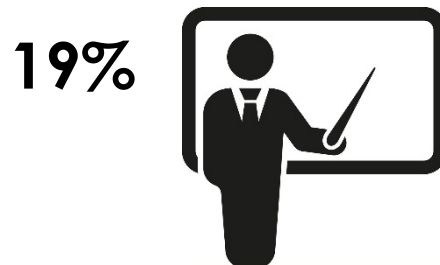

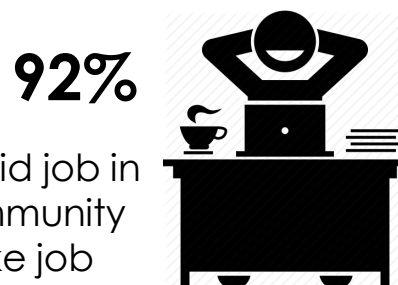

For Context: Lane et. al. v. Brown et. al. Civil Action – 2016 Report to the Court

- Within transition age population, 19.4% received Supported Employment Services and are working in a Competitive Integrated Employment setting for at least 20 hours per week
- From the sheltered workshop target population, 5.6% received Supported Employment Services and worked in a Competitive Integrated Employment Setting for at least 20 hours per week

People are satisfied and feel safe within their homes and neighborhood.

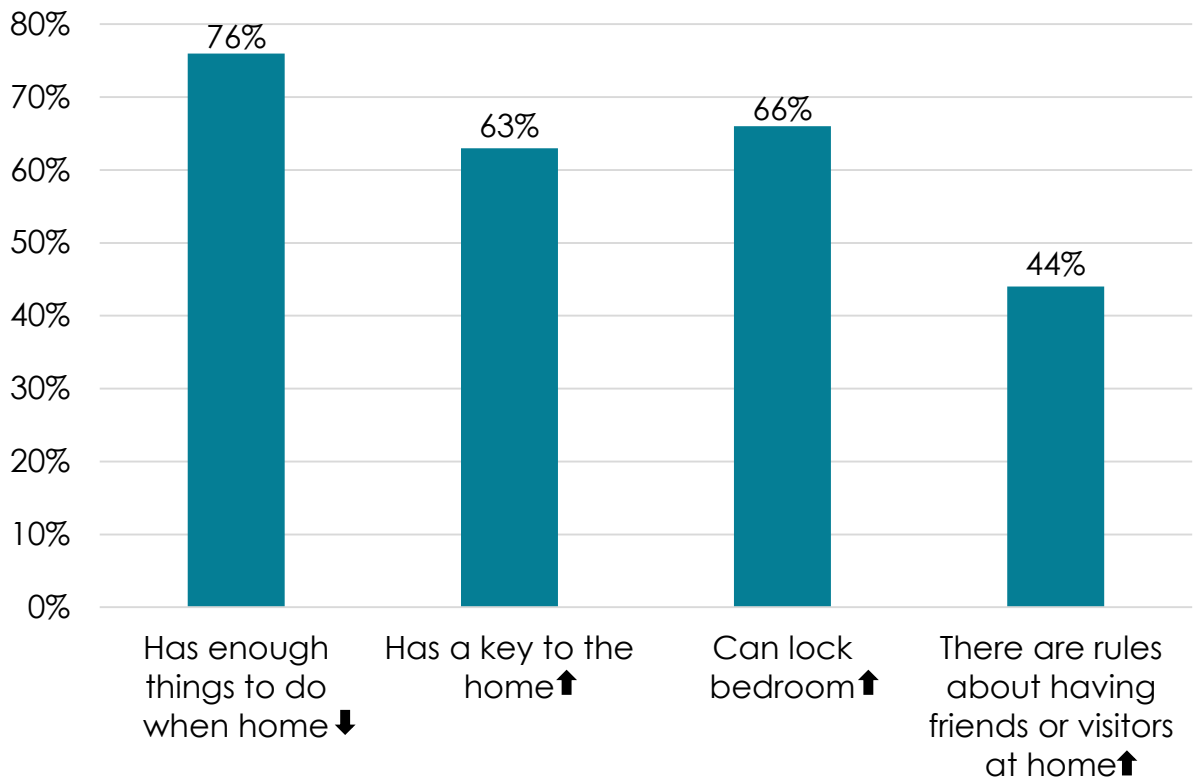
