

# A LETTER FROM THE DEAN

Dear Alumni & Friends,

As our country attempts to process the senseless deaths of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery, and many others, I recognize and feel the suffering, outrage, and concern of our community deeply. All of this is happening amid COVID-19, which brings to light, even more, the health and economic disparities that are in our state and nation. The School of Dentistry cares - not only about oral health but about the welfare and rights of the people who make up our community. We stand for justice, we stand against racism, we must never be indifferent to human suffering, we believe Black Lives Matter, and we need to continue trying to make the SoD the healthy, equitable, and inclusive place that we desire it to be. In a recent <u>letter</u> shared by President Jacobs, he has called for OHSU members to commit to dismantling racism at our university, in the health care industry, and our country. The School endorses this message wholeheartedly. Feel free to reach out to me if you would like to share your suggestions and ideas on how the SoD can be more supportive and welcoming.

On June 19th, 2020, Multnomah County entered Phase 1 of Governor Brown's reopening plan. Phase 1 will have minimal impacts on OHSU operations. OHSU is still in Modified Operations, and this won't change until University leadership determines that we are ready. The School's Emergency Dental Care Clinic (EDCC) has been serving patients who have true dental emergencies since March. Now that the School has entered Phase 1, OHSU's Dental Clinics are gradually reopening, starting with a limited number of appointments. Not all services are available at this time. Our goal is to remain compliant with Governor Brown's guidelines and consistently follow OHSU policy and best practices. The infrastructure that the EDCC established to carry-out procedures during the pandemic has greatly helped in the first part of our reopening. The EDCC discontinued operations at the end of June.



On June 7th, the University and the School of Dentistry celebrated our graduating class through a virtual Convocation and Hooding Ceremony. These events recognized our 75 new D.M.D.s and honored 18 post-doctoral residents. I am so impressed with the resilience of this class, and I know that you all have the fortitude to face this new era of dentistry. I am excited to see how they embrace and influence it. In this edition, you will learn more about our Class of 2020.

The Summer term is here! We will continue holding didactic classes online and will have limited clinic opportunities for our students. The great news is that we are also able to open the simulation laboratory on a limited basis, following social distancing rules. The students and faculty are excited to have it opened, even on a limited basis. Therefore, the students in the classes of 2022 and 2023 are continuing to develop the pre-clinical skills they will need for patient care (we will update you next month on how that goes). Our research labs are also in the process of returning to operations. In our July edition, we will be sharing additional information on how the SoD is transitioning into the "new normal." I want to take a moment to thank all who are helping in this endeavor. I look forward to seeing what the School of Dentistry will look like in the future.



# **GRADUATE PROFILE**

ZANYAR DARVISHI, D.M.D.

Darvishi studied chemistry and biology at PSU. In Iran, students in their last year of high school take an exam to determine their area of study in college. When Zanyar took the exam, he was placed in a civil engineering program. Although he loves science and math, Zanyar wanted to be a dentist. He came to the United States to choose the direction of his life and have the opportunity to work hard to accomplish his personal and professional goals.

To Zanyar, dentistry is a combination of science, art, and helping people. He also enjoys working with his hands, which he says makes him unique in his family. His father worked for an administrative office, his one sister is an accountant, and the other has her Master's degree in English and teaches. He is excited about being the first dentist in his family.

## EDCC IS PHASING OUT AT THE END OF JUNF

On June 19, 2020, all of Oregon officially entered into Phase 1 of reopening. Phase 1 is the first stage of Governor Brown's plan to build a state-wide infrastructure that allows Oregonians to stay safe while COVID-19 still poses a threat. It includes limiting the reopening of restaurants and bars, personal services, gyms, and malls. Gatherings of up to 25 people are allowed for recreational, social, cultural, civic, or faith events – with physical distancing requirements.

OHSU Dental Clinics are currently offering a limited number of appointments as part of our gradual reopening plan. Not all services are available at this time. The goal is to remain compliant with Governor Brown's guidelines and consistently follow OHSU policy and best practices. The health and well-being of our patients, dental care providers, and employees are our top priority. The reopening has been smooth thanks to the groundwork that was



established by the faculty and staff of the Emergency Dental Care Clinic (EDCC).

When COVID-19 began to impact our community, OHSU Dental Clinics understood that emergencies don't wait...not even for a pandemic. Dental infections can be life-threatening if not treated appropriately. The vast majority of dental clinics and practices in Oregon were forced to shut down due to a lack of PPE. The School of Dentistry worked with the hospital and was able to secure the PPE needed for the EDCC to treat patients and non-patients with true dental emergencies starting in March. The EDCC will phase-out in the last week of June. Karan J. Replogle, D.D.S., M.S., Chair of Endodontics, led the EDCC. Her managerial team on the ground was comprised of the following people:

# RESEARCH RECOGNITION

## ENGINEERING BONE TISSUE OF UNPRECEDENTED PRECISION

"We can now engineer bone-like tissue in the lab with the same complexity that nature does," said biomedical engineer <u>Luiz Bertassoni</u>, D.D.S., Ph.D., an assistant professor in the OHSU School of Dentistry and a member of CEDAR, the Cancer Early Detection Advanced Research Center in the OHSU Knight Cancer Institute. "This is the first time anyone has been able to embed cells in minerals, which is what characterizes bone tissue. Now we can address all the questions we couldn't before about how bone develops or interacts with disease in the context it happens in nature."

The new discovery replicates human bone tissue with an unprecedented level of precision, from its microscopic crystal structure to its biological activity. Like real bone, the material has a 3D mineral structure populated with bone cells, nerve cells, and endothelial cells that self-organize into functioning blood vessels. It takes 72 hours or less to create the material in a lab.

"We can reproduce the architecture of bone down to a nanometer scale," Bertassoni said. "Our model goes through the same biophysical process of formation that bone does."

#### **N**EW FORMULA CRACKS IMITATION BONE

Bone is a unique organ in the body, being an organic and inorganic nanocomposite, making it difficult to replicate. In this new method, Bertassoni and his team combine human stem cells and collagen, then expose the material to a cocktail of calcium and phosphate, along with the protein osteopontin. In this calcified environment, stem cells develop into functioning bone cells, osteoblasts, and osteocytes. When the OHSU scientists add nerve cells and endothelial cells to the mixture, they form interconnected networks that persist after mineralization.

This "bone in a dish" offers exciting implications for both basic and clinical research, providing a unique model to study bone function, diseases and regeneration.

"With this model system, you can start asking questions about how bone cells attract different types of cancers, how cancer cells move into bone, how bone takes part in the regulation of marrow function," Bertassoni said. "It can even be relevant to dissect the mechanisms that are leading to diseases such as leukemia."

The discovery is the first step in the development of a platform with multiple potential applications. Bertassoni and his team are now working to optimize the material for bone regeneration. They have tested the material as a replacement for injured bone in animal models with positive results that they expect to report soon. OHSU is working with the Food and Drug Administration to get the material cleared for use in humans.
