



ANSWER THE CALL

Contact tracing is a critical step to slow the spread of COVID-19.

If a public health worker reaches out, please answer your phone.

These calls are:

- Important
- Confidential
- Informative

IMPORTANT

Contact tracing is a key tool to limit the coronavirus in your community.

After someone tests positive, a health worker calls to:

- Find people who may have been exposed
- Ask them to stay home
- Watch for new infections
- Follow up with health resources

CONFIDENTIAL

Your information will be kept private.

Contact tracers will ask:

- Where you've been
- Who you've been near
- What symptoms you may have
- Your age, location and job
- For other details that could improve health care in Oregon

Contact tracers **never** ask for:

- Your Social Security number
- Your immigration status
- Credit card, bank or billing information

INFORMATIVE

A contact tracer can let you know:

- What symptoms to watch for
- How to get tested
- How to avoid spreading COVID-19
- Where to get help if you get sick
- How to care for yourself and others
