## The Surveyor's Point of View: Oregon RHC's Top Deficiencies

Janis McDowell, RN, BNS, MA, Patient Safety Surveyor, Oregon Health Authority RHC surveyors enter rural health clinics throughout Oregon to complete initial certification as requested and conduct recertification surveys approximately every seven years for non-deemed facilities and complaint surveys as needed. All surveys are unannounced. Every clinic is unique, but many of the cited deficiencies are common from clinic to clinic.
