

Highlights of our success

2015: Pepper Schedin, Ph.D.

Dr. Schedin's study found the first evidence that women's livers grow during pregnancy. Early results show that the liver shrinks after weaning, which may create an environment for cancer to metastasize. This could fundamentally change how we think about breast cancer in young women.

2010: Shoukhrat Mitalipov, Ph.D. & Paula Amato, M.D.

Dr. Mitalipov and Dr. Amato studied mitochondrial disease inherited from a mother's eggs. Because of federal funding restrictions on stem cell research the Circle's funding made this project possible. Resulting breakthroughs in cloning human stem cells were published in Nature.

2007: Richard Stouffer, Ph.D. & Judy Cameron, Ph.D.

Dr. Stouffer and Dr. Cameron investigated how androgen affects women's bodies during menopause. They have leveraged the findings our investment made possible to secure \$20 million for new work on androgens and infertility.
