



Pediatric Cervical Spine Clearance Protocol

Evaluation of a Child in a Rigid Cervical Collar

Apply to all patients < 15 years of age with low suspicion for fracture. If patient is symptomatic, consider early consultation with neurosurgery prior to imaging.



Child Age < 3 yrs

Strongly recommend cervical spine immobilization and plain radiograph if

patient has: altered mental status, focal neurologic deficits, apparent neck pain, torticollis, substantial torso injury, predisposing condition (Down's syndrome, JIA, OI, history of CSI), high risk-MVC (head-on collision, ejection, death in compartment, > 55MPH), axial load. If these factors are NOT present, clear at attending physician's discretion
