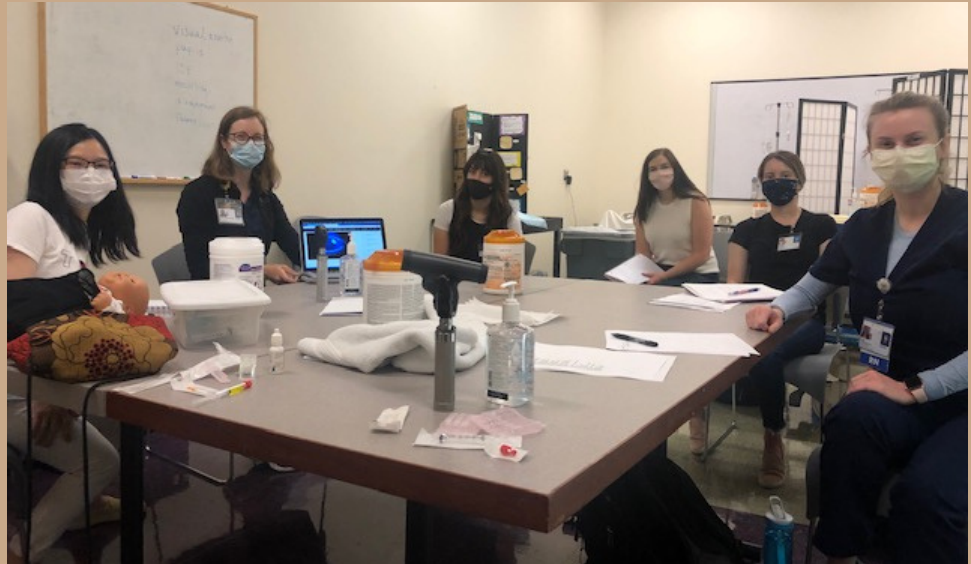

## *Student Role of Clinical Rotations*

Many students have asked me about expectations about clinical rotations. The student role is to come prepared, be open to continued learning and constructive feedback, and work with preceptors in a professional manner.

More detailed information will be sent in a separate email, but here are some key items.

- Contact your preceptor via email at least 2 weeks prior to your rotation to determine your schedule.
- Participate in orientation on specific to your clinical site, if applicable.
- Review policies & procedures for the site.
- Report to clinical site on time and in appropriate attire and demonstrate professional behavior and conduct.
- Wear your student ID badge.
- Come prepared!
- Have at least 2 clinical goals for each rotation and share with your preceptor.
- Maintain a patient/family contact log in Typhon.
