



### RURAL OREGON IS AGING FASTER

OREGON'S TOTAL RURAL POPULATION HAS GROWN BY 3% SINCE 2000.

OREGON'S 65+ RURAL POPULATION HAS GROWN BY 22% SINCE 2000.





### RURAL OREGON BEARS THE BRUNT

#### AGING IN RURAL AREAS IS MADE **MORE DIFFICULT BY:**

- Limited broadband
- Longer distances
- Fewer local services
- Lower lifetime incomes
- Less infrastructure
- Poorer health status


## WHAT IS A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR LIVING + AGING?

- It's a cross-sector effort that includes strategies for 10+ years
- It includes a broad pool of stakeholders from the beginning of the process
- It's institutionalized by executive and legislative branches
- It's developed to guide the restructuring of state and local policy, programs and funding that is geared toward aging well in the community

#### SHARED FUTURE OREGON BENEFITS COMMUNITIES BY:

- Building partnerships among government agencies and departments
- Facilitating collaboration among diverse groups, families, businesses and many more public and private stakeholders
- Promoting equity and inclusion to combat bias and discrimination
- Raising awareness and responding to the impact of aging policy across the lifespan

### AGE-FRIENDLY STATE

#### WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BECOME AN AGE-FRIENDLY STATE?

- Creating an Oregon where everyone can live and age well in the community they choose
- Leadership from the Governor and legislature
- Meaningful engagement by Oregonians, community and business leaders, to find solutions for our most pressing challenges
- Addressing the critical needs of all Oregonians as we age and developing and investing in agefriendly policies and programs
- Enrolling in the global WHO and national AARP Networks of Age-Friendly States and Territories
- Creating a policy environment that empowers and supports communities to become more age-friendly

#### OUR PEOPLE ARE THE FUTURE

Oregon's demographics require **URGENT** action. Over 35% of the people living in Oregon are over the age of 50 with an increasingly diversifying population.

#### **MOMENTUM IS HERE**

There is already a roadmap! Other states have recognized the **value** in advancing a Comprehensive Plan for Living + Aging to Become an Age-Friendly State. Massachusetts, Texas, California and New York governors have issued executive orders. Vermont, Colorado and California legislatures have also affirmed this work through legislation.

#### FISCALLY RESPONSIBLE + NECESSARY

By developing a plan that supports agency leadership and interagency collaboration, Oregon can support fiscally responsible policies that also promote financial advancement for their communities.

Oregon is leading the way in so many areas when it comes to putting people first. This initiative continues to honor the values of who we are as Oregonians.




