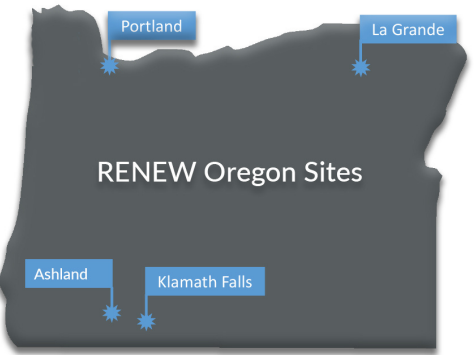
Regional Expansion of Nurse Practitioner Education and Workforce in Oregon

Year Two Report 2020-2021

One of the grant goals is to engage Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) and Psychiatric/ Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) students in collaborations with rural and underserved communities and clinical partners to develop and lead quality improvement projects that contribute to best practices and/or value-based healthcare delivery communities in Oregon.



In Year 2, \$361,880 was awarded to 24 FNP and PMHNP students across all four sites.

The poster is divided into several sections: **Background** (addressing the period between childhood and adulthood, noting that 15% of adolescents in the US are LGBQ+), **Problem Description** (discussing health disparities and systemic issues), **School Health Centers** (describing their role and benefits), **Survey Instrument** (detailing the survey's purpose and findings), **Results** (presenting data on knowledge and barriers), and **Recommendations** (suggesting training programs and data collection). It also includes **Specific Aims** and **Methods** for the research.



In 2020-21, 20 FNP and PMHNP students completed quality improvement projects in clinical agencies across Oregon.
