

Student Exposures to COVID-19 Protocol

Students exposed to COVID-19 through clinical and other in-person rotations should follow the protocol below. Students who are exposed to COVID-19 but are taking online courses do not need to report exposures to OHSU. Students in didactic courses that are exposed, develop symptoms and can no longer participate in course activities should seek medical care from the OHSU Student Health & Wellness Center, the student health center on the regional campus, or their PCP as appropriate. Students should also contact their program director to discuss the impact on academic progress.

<p>Reporting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Determine whether the incident is a significant exposure. Refer to the Criteria for Workplace or Community COVID-19 Exposures. If exposure is High Risk and you are unvaccinated or immunocompromised, report the exposure using OHSU Online Reporting Tool and follow all of the requirements of the Criteria for Workplace or Community COVID-19 Exposures. Notify your program if you have been quarantined. 	<p>Reporting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow all occupational health protocols at the clinical site/rotation. If clinical sites do not have occupational health services, the student should follow all OHSU protocols as if the exposure occurred at OHSU. If exposure is High Risk and you are unvaccinated or immunocompromised report using OHSU Online Reporting Tool. Notify attending faculty or supervisor and your program if you have been quarantined. 	<p>Undergraduate nursing students in Ashland, Monmouth, Klamath Falls and La Grande should follow the SON Regional Campus Student Exposure to COVID-19 Protocol found on the o2 Student Onward page.</p> <p>SON graduate students in Portland based distance education programs should follow the COVID-19 Exposure Protocol as outlined by this document for Portland-based students.</p>
<p>Testing/Monitoring</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students should review Criteria for Workplace or Community COVID-19 Exposures to determine appropriate level of monitoring based on their exposure risk and follow these guidelines. 	<p>Testing/Monitoring</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow all occupational health protocols for monitoring symptoms as required by the clinical site/rotation. If occupational health services are not offered at the site, the student should follow all OHSU monitoring protocols. 	
<p>If you develop symptoms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students in need of medical care should contact their medical provider at Student Health & Wellness Center or their PCP as appropriate. Students who develop symptoms should stop all clinical or in-person activities, wear a mask, and isolate at home. If a student needs medical care they should contact the OHSU Student Health & Wellness Center or their PCP as appropriate. 	<p>If you develop symptoms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students under quarantine who develop symptoms should follow the occupational health protocols of the clinical site. Other students who develop symptoms should stop all clinical or in-person activities, wear a mask, and isolate at home. If a student needs medical care they should contact the OHSU Student Health & Wellness Center, their PCP or

Options for testing include OHSU's Occupational Health drive-through site, requesting saliva testing at Student Health & Wellness Center through this survey, or in the community. • Students that test positive for COVID-19 are required to report positive results (even those obtained at Student Health & Wellness Center or Occupational Health) via Enterprise Health and notify their program directly of their in-person restrictions and return to work date. 	<p>other local urgent care/emergency medical care as appropriate.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Symptomatic students should get testing as soon as possible. Students that are positive for COVID-19 are required to report positive results (even those obtained at Student Health & Wellness Center or Occupational Health) via Enterprise Health and notify their program directly of their in-person restrictions and return to work date.

<p>Return to Clinic or Other Rotations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who develop symptoms, (including students with a negative COVID-19 test), must follow the OHSU Guidelines for Illness Exclusions and Return to Work. • Students who are ready to return to clinical or other rotations should consult their program director regarding scheduling. 	<p>Return to Clinic or Other Rotations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who develop symptoms, (including students with a negative COVID-19 test), must follow the OHSU Guidelines for Illness Exclusions and Return to Work, but may be required to meet more stringent requirements as determined by the non-OHSU clinical site. • Students who are ready to return to clinical or other rotations should consult their program director regarding scheduling.
