WHAT TO KNOW:

- Gov, businesses don't contact you out of the blue about a "problem"
- Concerned? Contact the entity at a trusted phone number
- Make no payments, share no sensitive info

Investment Fraud



- Free lunches
- Cold calls
- "Act now" pressure tactics

RED FLAGS:

- You don't recall entering
- You need to pay an upfront fee to collect the prize

Lottery Scams



- "You've just won!"
- Must pay taxes and processing fees upfront



ONLINE ROMANCE

Scrabble Online Words with Friends Match.com
Plenty of Fish Facebook

RED FLAGS:

- Wants to move to another way of communicating
- Never able to meet in person
- Urgent need for money (eventually)
- Drofossos lovo corby on
- Professes love early on

Tech Support Scams



 Call from alleged tech company that they have detected a virus

 Popup window urges you to call in order to address a virus problem

AARP° CAN YOU DO ME A FAVOR?

"I'm in a board meeting and need you to pick up 40 \$100 Amazon cards for an employee appreciation event ... Send me pictures of the cards and the receipt – you can expense them." Thanks-JAJ "I had to run into the city and didn't have time to buy Target gift cards for a new family in need. Can you buy \$500 worth and I'll pay you back? Send a picture of the back."


Thanks!—

RED FLAGS:

- Brief, urgent message
- Person is unavailable and needs a quick favor
- Buy gift cards and share the numbers off the back

VIOLENT AND PROPERTY CRIMES: HOW WE REACT

HOW WE TALK ABOUT FRAUD VICTIMS

You got duped by that?? It's the oldest trick in the book!

You'd have to be an idiot...

How could he fall for that??

How much money did you give them?



HOW VICTIMS TALK ABOUT THEMSELVES

I can't believe I fell for this!

How could I be so stupid??



RIPPED FROM THE HEADLINES

Suspect in knifepoint robbery arrested in SE Portland

Woman scammed of \$35,000

LET'S FLIP THE NARRATIVE

What if we said:

"Falling victim is not your fault. It's the fault of the criminal who perpetrated this crime. I am sorry you've had to endure this."

BEYOND SEMANTICS

- More victims will report the crime
- Family relationships will be protected
- Police recognize scams as a crime not civil
- Prosecutors take on more cases
- Policy makers act

THE TOLL

Billions of dollars lost with little chance of restitution

 Nearly 2/3 of victims report experiencing at least one serious health or emotional impact

Thousands die by suicide

Prevention Strategies

- Avoid making financial decisions in a heightened emotional state
- Screen phone calls; watch out for fake emails and text messages
- Develop a refusal script or have a "buddy"

- Do your research
 - Charities: charitynavigator.org, give.org
 - Brokers: brokercheck.finra.org
- Ask friends for recommendations

- Protect personal information
- Shred sensitive information
- Monitor bills and financial accounts
- Watch over your credit reports

 - √ 877.322.8228

Consider a fraud alert or **credit freeze** for your credit reports

- Equifax
- Experien
- TransUnion

- Keep operating & antivirus software current
- Keep your passwords private don't share
- Use unique passwords for EACH online account
- Consider a password manager
