- Other topics include early intervention and communication, health disparities, and reproductive justice



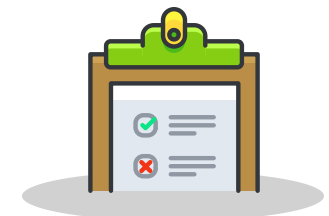
Service
