OHSU Internal Medicine Clinic ("IMC") - is located at the Physicians Pavilion on the main OHSU campus. This clinic is an inclusive environment in which adults of all ethnicities, gender identities, cultures, national origins, sexual orientations, races, religions and social and educational backgrounds are seen. Thirty percent of the patient population is underinsured. Resident providers in the IMC work on highly functioning clinic teams, and they are supported by a linked core preceptor, medical assistants, team-based panel coordinators, nurses and nurse care managers, advanced practice providers, behavioral support specialists/social work, an on-site physical therapist, and clinical pharmacists. You are supported by a large dedicated teaching faculty, who are passionate about ambulatory care and who are natural mentors for you while you see patients in clinic or by virtual visits. Our clinic is in one of the highest tiers (Tier 4 or 5, a tier that is assigned yearly) for the Oregon Health Authority Patient-Centered Primary Care Home Program (PCPCH). Residents have access to personalized panel-based data and time is set aside for engage in highly valued, structured practice-based learning sessions. We are currently developing a structured supervision for residents using point-of-care ultrasound in the ambulatory setting. Within the clinic, there is support for diverse patient populations: Geriatric consultation, HIV care, women's health, complex psychiatric consultation, and Hepatitis C treatment, and specialized clinics for medication-assisted treatment for substance use disorders and complex chronic pain. Faculty from our clinic provide consultation in OHSU's Long COVID clinic. In addition to standard referrals, providers can utilize our eConsult program (in which specialists consult, educate, and advise the primary provider outside of an office visit). The clinic uses the Epic electronic medical record system, which is the same system utilized by the OHSU inpatient services. Our EPIC interface contains quick links to useful decision-aid and information references including UpToDate, VisualDx and Micromedex. While in their ambulatory week, residents spend most of their between-visit time in a shared charting and conference space with a beautiful view of the Willamette River, the OHSU tram, and Mt. Hood. We hope you will join us here!
